

Chronically homeless means:

1. A **“homeless individual with a disability,”** as defined in section 401(9) of the McKinney-Vento Homeless Assistance Act (42 U.S.C. 11360(9)), who:
[An individual who can be diagnosed with one or more of the following conditions: substance use disorder, serious mental illness, developmental disability (as defined in section 102 of the Developmental Disabilities Assistance Bill of Rights Act of 2000 (42 U.S.C. 15002)), post-traumatic stress disorder, cognitive impairments resulting from brain injury, or chronic physical illness or disability]
 - a. Lives in a place not meant for human habitation, a safe haven, or in an emergency shelter; and
 - b. Has been homeless and living as described in paragraph (1)(i) of this definition continuously for at least **12 months** [one year] or on at least 4 separate occasions in the last 3 years, **as long as the combined occasions equal at least 12 months and each break in homelessness separating the occasions included at least 7 consecutive nights of not living as described in paragraph (1)(i). Stays in institutional care facilities for fewer than 90 days will not constitute a break in homelessness, but rather such stays are included in the 12-month total, as long as the individual was living or residing in a place not meant for human habitation, a safe haven, or an emergency shelter immediately before entering the institutional care facility;**
2. An individual who has been residing in an institutional care facility, including a jail, substance abuse or mental health treatment facility, hospital, or other similar facility, for fewer than 90 days and met all of the criteria in paragraph (1) of this definition, before entering that facility; or
3. A family with an adult head of household (or if there is no adult in the family, a minor head of household) who meets all of the criteria in paragraph (1) or (2) of this definition, including a family whose composition has fluctuated while the head of household has been homeless.

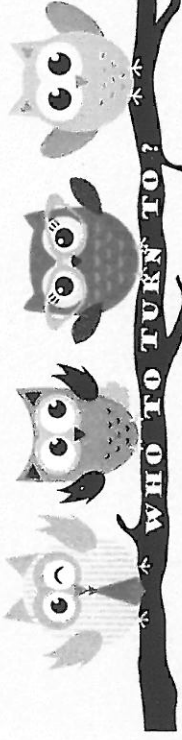

Descriptions of Beaver County McKinney Vento Supportive Housing Programs

Community Assisted Residential Living (C.A.R.L.) is a tenant based rental model administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County in which rental assistance vouchers in the form of Tenant Based Rental Assistance (TBRA) will be issued to chronically homeless or homeless households with an illness or a disability. The Program focuses on households with the longest length of homelessness, homeless households with children, veterans, and victims of domestic violence. It is a Permanent Supportive Housing (PSH) program within Beaver County's Continuum of Care. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Contact information: Renee Speaker hacbrspeaker@comcast.net

Crescent Commons is a permanent supportive housing program administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County which provides housing vouchers to participants who are chronically homeless with disabilities and who have exhausted all other housing options. At full operational capacity the program should house approx 31 people. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Friendship Homes is a 33 bed permanent supportive housing program administered by the Salvation Army for both chronically homeless and non-chronically homeless individuals and families with disabilities. There is a 5 bed single site for homeless men in New Brighton. The other program participants are housed in apartments at College Hill Apartments in Beaver Falls. Julie's Place provides permanent supportive housing to 12 chronically homeless individuals and families with mental illness, physical and health issues, and substance abuse issues. The program is administered by Changing the World, Inc. Individuals and families live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Melrose Place LIFE Beaver County's permanent supportive housing program which will serve approximately 16 disabled homeless senior persons, prioritizing chronically homeless adults and veterans from the surrounding Beaver County community. The program participants will be housed in scattered sites located in the Beaver County community, with a provision for rental assistance and moderate case management services. The program is currently under development.

Safety Net is a TBRA program administered by the Housing Authority of Beaver County which provides rental assistance to adult individuals with chronic mental illness who are difficult to place in current permanent housing. This project is considered housing of last resort, since the target population is Chronically Homeless (CH) adults who come from the streets and traditionally fall through the cracks. Individuals live in scattered sites. The program is not funded to provide case management services. Contact information: Lisa Kelleher hacblk@comcast.net

Stone Harbour is a transitional supportive housing program administered by Cornerstone Recovery and Supports (CRS) which provides supportive housing for 12 chronically homeless individuals struggling with co-occurring disorders of mental illness and substance abuse, as well as those with legal histories.
