1. OPEN DISCUSSION

Herta Madder (BCBH) announced a full time grant funded position for a youth outreach worker through Baden Academy. For more information call BCBH at 724.891.2827.

Marie Timpano (The Conerstone of Beaver County) announced TCBC's Souper Bowl fundraiser on 1/27 from 2-6pm at Beaver Brewery in Beaver Falls. Tickets are \$25 and you get a variety of homemade soups, bread, and raffles. Plus Beaver Brewery will donate a portion of their proceeds from their specialty drink.

Rebecca Salopak (Housing Authority/Christian Assembly) thanked everyone for their contributions to the Annual Christmas Dinner. She reported that it was a great success serving an estimated 1,100 people. She reminded the group that it is never too early to start thinking about next year!

Dina Ciabattoni (CoC Coordinator) provided the following updates:

- Housing Opportunities is hiring a part time housing counselor. They will train the person. Interested parties should call 724.728.7202.
- The Home4Good awards were announced. 1 project was funded out of the 3 projects who applied. The Salvation Army received \$57,000 to attach a Rapid Rehousing component to Harmony House.

The mission of the Housing and Homeless Coalition of Beaver County is to provide support, direction, and collaboration in effectively addressing the issues of homelessness and affordable, sustainable housing in Beaver County by identifying and utilizing all available resources.

- All of the CoC funded and ESG programs are still able to draw down funds despite the government partial shut-down. Dina reported that they do not anticipate any problems with accessing funds as long contracts remain current. She did note that the CoC Awards would most likely not be announced until the government is fully back open.
- Dina provided a master copy of the most recently updated street resource card. She stated that we will still be providing cut copies but that agencies can also make their own copies from this master copy as needed.

Lisa Signore (Community Development Program) reported that the Community Development Block Grant (CDBG), Emergency Solutions Grant, and HOME applications are due 3/29/2019. A CDBG information session is scheduled for 1/22/19 from 3 pm – 5 pm at BCTA (200 West Washington Street Rochester, PA). Greater Pittsburgh Food Bank

Tabitha Reefer

Tabitha is the Greater Pittsburgh Food Bank Outreach Coordinator for Beaver County and surrounding counties. She helps coordinate the summer youth feeding programs in Beaver County and is available to assist with SNAP applications. She informed the group about the mobile market which serves areas that are considered food deserts. Additionally she passed out information on Produce for the People and several other programs. See attached. She also spoke about a research project that the Food Bank is currently conducting to better understand the food security issues facing youth. UPMC Community HealthChoices Ben Hampton and Tiffany Kinney

UPMC Community HealthChoices is a managed care organization overseeing the insurance program for adults who are dual eligible for Medicaid and Medicare OR who are eligible for Medicaid and qualify for long term services and supports. Ben and Tiffany provided an overview of the program including several benefits associated with the plan. They explained that DHS determines eligibility and then the individual can chose the managed care plan they want. People can switch between plans to best meet their needs. They report that UPMC Community HealthChoices is set up to coordinate care between mental health and physical health providers. They have a 24 hour concierge team. And they have a community engagement team that can come provide education about the details and benefits of the plan. HealthChoices also provides Care Giver support groups, participant feedback sessions, and Healthcare provider meetings. See attached flier for more information. Point in Time Survey

Renee Speaker

Renee announced the Point In Time survey is scheduled for January 23, 2019. She reports we are still in need of donations (gloves, hats, toiletries, non-perishable food items) and volunteers to help with packing the bags, covering the drop-in centers, and doing outreach. Renee also asked for people to take fliers and hang them at their agencies and in their communities to help get the word out. She reported that the bag packing for the outreach teams to hand out will take place on 1/19 at 9 am at The Cornerstone.

Dina added that the Point In Time survey is required by HUD and its an opportunity to demonstrate to HUD that our efforts are collaborative, coordinated, and effective. The numbers from the survey become part of our formal reports to HUD and serve as a measure of our progress toward ending homelessness. She also asked for any new information on locations where homeless people have been seen.
