

June 11, 2020 Meeting Minutes

Welcome and Housekeeping: Dina called the meeting to order at 1:35 as some folks were still logging on.

Since the Housing & Homeless Coalition welcomes ideas, opinions, and knowledge from a broad spectrum of partners, meetings are open to the public and new members are always welcomed. Meetings take place the 2nd Thursday of every month at 1:30 pm in the CYS Conference Room on Zoom until further notice.

May Meeting Minutes: No issues were noted with the minutes.

1. OPEN DISCUSSION

Harry Angelo (Job Training) announced that JT and CareerLink staff will be returning to their offices on Monday June 15th and opening to the public on July 1st. He noted that the Mall hours are 11-7. Due to limitations of social distancing – Harry recommended that clients still use the phone and chat communication methods over coming into the center at least at the beginning. Questions can be directed to: 724.728.2020.

Marie Timpano (The Cornerstone) noted that they are in the process of gathering supplies and getting their social distancing protocols into place according to CDC guidelines. She noted that they have hired an administrative assistance who will start next week and will help implement these protocols. She anticipates a soft opening for clients the week of June 22^{nd} .

Deb Ferguson (Glade Run Psych Rehab) noted that their location in Rochester (191 S. Park Street Rochester, PA 15074) will have a soft opening on Monday June 22nd. They will be following all CDC guidelines for social distancing.

Makesha West (RHD) noted that they have available Detox and Rehabilitation beds. She stated their power has been restored and they are ready to take new referrals.

Rebecca Salopek (Crossroads/Housing Authority/CARES Outreach Ministries) thanked everyone who submitted support letters on behalf of Crossroads during the public comment period for the CARES Act funding. She stated that they are hopeful this will get Crossroads closer to securing a shelter for men. She noted that Crossroads is still available to help with outreach, gift cards, tangible items etc. They can be reached at 724.846.1303 or info@bccrossroads.org. She reported a recent decrease in calls and wondered if others were experiencing that as well. She noted that they recently received funding from the Pittsburgh Foundation for PPE and other tangible goods.

She also reported that CARES Outreach Ministry also received a grant from the Pittsburgh Foundation to provide support to people living in Housing Authority sites.

Marie Timpano (The Cornerstone) endorsed the critical need for a men's emergency shelter and noted that they recently received a grant from the Pittsburgh Foundation to help cover the costs of hotels. She



reported a significant increase in the need for hotels since access to shelter beds has decreased during the pandemic. From the period 3/27/2020 to 5/31/2020, TCBC has placed 36 households in hotels with an average stay of 30 days. She acknowledged the hotels as "plugging the hole" and recognized that shelter is very much needed.

Penny Jones (Landlord Partner) asked if we were considering the option of mediation to help households avoid court eviction proceedings. Dina noted that this strategy is under consideration. She thanked Penny for the suggestion.

Rebecca Salopek (HA) noted that many of their tenants are still waiting on Unemployment Compensation and she asked if others were experiencing these delays as well. Several attendees confirmed that their clients are experiencing this. Harry noted that the State called back 80 retired UC workers to help manage the backlog and stated that it is still just taking that long due to the unprecedented amount of people accessing the system.

Rebecca also noted that free meals will be available throughout the summer for all residents of Housing Authority sites. Meals will be available on Tuesdays and Thursdays from 11-12. She stated the YMCA will be providing the bagged meals and will be able to give multiple meals to help folks make it until the next distribution day. See attached flyer.

Nancy Grieco (Red Cross) announced that the Red Cross assisted in 6 events affecting 14 adults and 4 children since May 1st. She stated a few of the households had been assisted by TCBC. She noted that the Red Cross will continue to follow all CDC guidance regarding reopening.

Marie Timpano (The Cornerstone) announced a diaper drive in partnership with Choices Pregnancy Services and Light of Salvation Church. Sue Smith from Choices clarified the drive will take place at 1117 5th Avenue Beaver Falls on June 18th from 12pm – 4:30pm. See attached flyer.

Marie also reminded everyone that TCBC has funding from PetSmart Charities to assist households with costs related to their pets and service animals during a housing crisis.

She also noted that with the support of the Pittsburgh Foundation they have purchased ipads to be used for the purpose of the Census. She is working on putting protocols in place to ensure hygienic conditions for clients who use the ipads to complete their Census surveys.

Finally, she announced that their Facebook page and website have been updated. She stated that they are happy to share partner announcements, flyers, etc.

Paul Lebanik (St. Vincent DePaul) noted a decrease in calls but stated he expects things to pick back up soon. Jan Davis asked if St. Monica's would be resuming services soon as they aren't doing home visits. Paul clarified that they are not doing home visits either but the St. Vincent DePaul sites are providing service over the phone.



Jan Davis (Central United Methodist Church) thanked everyone for their donations to the Soup Kitchen. She stated that since 3/16/2020 to present, they have served 7,000 meals. She noted that they will continue to provide meals 5 days a week and on the first and second Saturdays of the month. See attached Meal Schedule.

Dina Ciabattoni (CoC Coordinator) announced that BCCAN has a new website where you can directly register for the trainings. Lynell Scaff will attend the August meeting to give us an update on the fall trainings.

Dina also shared the Pittsburgh Food Back summer meal schedule. See attached.

2. AGENDA Dina Ciabattoni

Eviction moratoriums

Dina gave an update on the eviction moratoriums. She stated that the State moratorium runs through July 10^{th} and the Federal moratorium (on properties that receive federal subsidies) runs through July 25^{th} . She reminded the group that once the moratoriums are lifted landlords still have to give 30 days notice. She also noted that with the CARES Act funding we are hoping to use it to assist households prior to reaching eviction thereby assisting both the client and the landlords.

CARES Act funding

Dina stated that the special amendment has been submitted to our local HUD Field Office for final approval. She reported that because HUD is trying to get funding to communities quickly we do not expect this process to take long but no specific timeline was provided.

Dina also reported that we have been notified of our 2nd CARES Act ESG allotment – totaling \$685,000. We do not have any further details about the funding at this time but we welcome any ideas you may have for this funding to address pressing needs related to the Coronavirus pandemic.

Coronavirus Relief Fund Advocacy update

Dina noted that our advocacy efforts to our PA state legislators to utilize a portion of the Coronavirus Relief Fund for Rental Assistance were successful. They allocated \$175 million to mortgage relief and rental assistance. And another \$10 million to Homeless Assistance Grants. These funds will go through PHFA for distribution to communities. No further details are available at this time.

Technical Assistance for Locating a Men's Shelter

Dina stated that 8 proposals to locate a feasible location for a men's emergency shelter were received. Each proposal was scored against a matrix with the highest scored proposal being selected and then approved by the Commissioners. This proposal belonged to Klavon Design Associates. We expect them to begin this project around the beginning of August (once it goes to resolution and the contracts are signed). The scope of work will be completed within 60 days. This company has done prior work in Beaver County and has rich experience and knowledge around municipal codes and zoning ordinances. At the conclusion of the project we expect to be presented with 3 feasible locations.



New CoC Website and PPE

Dina reported that the county received Community Services Block Grant discretionary funds which will be used for two purposes. The first is to build a CoC website. Many of the features found on the HMIS website will be embedded into the new website and it will be expanded and updated for user ease. We also requested funding in order to stockpile PPE, and cleaning products. In light of the pandemic we have learned that it is good practice to have these supplies on hand not only for reopening, and if there is another surge of Coronavirus but also for the regular flu season. We will notify our CoC partners when these supplies are available in case you are in need of them.

Bed Availability

Dina shared the bed availability chart and noted few openings. She did report that the Housing Authority is now renting their high-rise and walk-up units (see attached chart for which buildings have vacancies). Also the Housing Choice Voucher program is open again. The HA main office remains closed to the public but there are staff available at all of the sites. Dina also reported that there are only 7 people on the PSH waiting list and 7 people on the TH waiting list. Paul L. asked if these people are the people who are in hotels. Marie explained that clients in hotels are expected to go through Coordinated Entry - so she confirmed that yes some of the hotel clients are reflected on these wait lists. However she noted that a few clients in hotels have complex behavioral health needs making it very difficult for CE staff to connect with them. She reported that she is working with BH partners to best address these situations.



Gov. Signs Bill to Allocate \$175 Million for Rental and Mortgage Assistance, \$10 million in Homeless Assistance Grants

Dear Dina,

We are excited to announce that today Governor Wolf signed legislation allocating some of the federal CARES Act funding, which included a \$175M allocation for a COVID-19 Relief Mortgage and Rental Assistance Program and an additional \$10M for Homeless Assistance Grants.

The Housing Alliance of Pennsylvania thanks Governor Wolf and members of the General Assembly for recognizing that housing, specifically rental assistance, has to be part of Pennsylvania's economic recovery plan from COVID-19. The funds appropriated will support communities in preventing evictions for tenants, stabilizing landlord small businesses, and ensuring that adequate support is provided to those that were one paycheck away from homelessness.

We also thank all of our supporters and members like you who helped to advocate for this critical funding. Your voices helped to make this new assistance a reality!

Assistance is necessary because less than 1 in 3 renters have enough money set aside for a three-month emergency with too many households on the brink, living paycheck to paycheck. The need for rental assistance and other supports for low-income families has only grown since the onset of the pandemic.

Allocating funding for rental assistance will help tenants who are behind on rent, due to a COVID-19 related job loss, maintain their payments. And while there is an eviction moratorium in place until July 11, rent is still due, and the funding will help households avoid eviction once the moratorium is lifted.
