

October 8, 2020 Meeting Agenda

Welcome and Housekeeping: Dina called the meeting to order at 1:35 pm. She reminded the group that the session was being recorded and asked folks to "sign-in" in the chat. She welcomed new members: Heather Slaughter (Self Determination Housing Project) and Vicky Zanottti (Allies for Health & Wellness).

Since the Housing & Homeless Coalition welcomes ideas, opinions, and knowledge from a broad spectrum of partners, meetings are open to the public and new members are always welcomed. Meetings take place the 2nd Thursday of every month at 1:30 pm in the CYS Conference Room on Zoom until further notice. 1. OPEN DISCUSSION

Cynthia Gilkey (Neighborhood Legal Services) asked folks to complete a 2 minute provider survey to help NLS determine how their Covid-19 funds could best be implemented. The survey link is: https://www.surveymonkey.com/r/ZGXSTGN
Cyndi stated that it can be shared widely.

Kevin Huwe (DON Services) reminded folks of the USDA grant available to assist homeowners living with a disability to make home repairs and accessibility modifications. He noted that grants are up to \$3,000 and matching funds are required. He stated that DON Services staff can assist participants with securing the match. For more info, call: 724.652.5144.

Natalie Meade (Head Start/Early Head Start) reported that they are still enrolling students. Instruction has been virtual but they are transitioning back into the classroom 2 days a week. For families who are not comfortable returning to the classroom, virtual and take home instruction will continue to be provided. Technical support and devices are provided. She also noted that they are hiring Instructors, Aides, and a fatherhood program case manager to work on job development. If interested, call: <u>724-728-2110</u>.

Dina Ciabattoni (Continuum of Care Coordinator) made several announcements:

- Dina reported on behalf of the Red Cross that since 9/9/20 there were two fires. One in Beaver Falls and one in Monaca affecting 9 people 3 adults and 6 children.
- She reminded the group that the Veteran Stand Down is scheduled for 11/6/2020 and will take place in The Cornerstone parking lot. She stated that they are still in need of

2. AGENDA

Flu Vaccines Dina Ciabattoni

Dina stated that the CDC and HUD are asking communities to encourage our homeless clients to consider getting the flu shot this year. With Covid-19 still present in our community, a flu surge could overwhelm our healthcare system and further stretch our emergency shelter system. She stated that she has an inquiry into the State Health Department to see about getting low cost/free vaccines. Additionally, Dr. Hagberg from HVHS Family Practice is looking into the issue as well.

Drug & Alcohol supports during the pandemic

Tracy Irwin

Tracy provided an overview of the services that their office provides. She stated that they can do an assessment of need to determine which supports and treatment would be most beneficial for the person. She stated that they can fund treatment for people who are uninsured or underinsured. And they have assisted providers with setting up tele-health and testing. She noted that her office also provides on-going case management to address a variety of needs. For more information, call: 724.89.2827.

Herta noted that the state law on confidentiality for youth in mental health treatment has recently changed which makes it easier for parents to commit their child who may be in need of involuntary treatment. More information can be found here: https://www.paparentandfamilyalliance.org/learnwithus

The Lighthouse Amy Frank

Amy announced a new program in partnership between the Salvation Army and CYS. She described it as similar to Harmony House. Eligible households will have CYS involvement and be more stable in their recovery. It will be less structured than Harmony House with case management offered a few times a week. There are three apartments. Additionally, they are hiring a case manager it can be either a part time position just at The Lighthouse or a full time position split between The Lighthouse and Harmony House. <u>ESG-CV funding</u> has started to be implemented. At this time, it is being used to support the Hotel Program, Homeless Hotline (724.494.0726), and Project ID.

Men's Emergency Shelter The firm that is helping to identify a location for the shelter is wrapping up their work. We expect a final report in the coming days with several recommended locations.

<u>Point In Time survey</u> Dina noted that HUD has not made a final decision on how they will handle the PIT survey during the pandemic. It seems like they may waive the unsheltered count and still require the sheltered count which is done primarily through HMIS.

<u>CoC Grant Competition</u> Dina stated that HUD has not made a decision on how they are going to handle the CoC Grant Competition yet. It seems they may just renew all of the programs but Congress will have to make that final decision.

<u>PPE</u> Community Development Program has masks, gloves, hand sanitizer, wipes, and thermometers for your staff and clients. Contact Cassie at 724.770.2040 to let her know what you need.

<u>Homeless Memorial</u> Dina asked if anyone would be interested in helping to plan the Homeless Memorial this year. She did report that we have lost a few homeless people this year in the county which makes the event even more significant. She stated that a planning meeting will be scheduled soon.

<u>Racial Disparity subcommittee</u> Dina stated that the group met in September and identified two goals: to identify equity measures to be used in our Covid-19 response and to raise awareness of racial inequity in our work. The next meeting is Oct. 20 at 10 am. The meeting takes place on Zoom so let Dina know if you are interested in attending.



- Please complete a reservation at pittsburghfoodbank.org/drive-up or by calling 412-460-3663 ext. 655. You will need your name, email, zip code, email address, current weekly income and license plate number for the car picking up food.
- This event will serve 500 households. There are no exceptions to one
 reservation getting one share of food. For one car to get two or three
 shares of food, the car must have more than one family or household. Each
 household must complete a separate reservation. The same car and license
 plate can be used up to three times for the same event.
- Please do not arrive to the distribution before the scheduled start time. If you made a reservation, you will receive food.
- For everyone's safety and to maintain social distancing guidelines, individuals must stay in their cars at all times except to use the provided outdoor restroom facilities. Leaving cars to socialize is prohibited.
- After pulling up to distribution area, put the car in park and then unlock the trunk or backseat for food to be loaded. For everyone's safety, volunteers will not be able to load food into the cars until they are in park.
- · Please do not get out of the car when food is being loaded into the car.
- Stay alert and follow the guidance of Food Bank staff and police as they direct cars through the distribution area.


