### 1. OPEN DISCUSSION

**Lisa Diaz (Job Training)** discussed Job Training's entrepreneurial training. She noted that applicants must be Beaver County resident and have a low income. She noted that the trainings consist of 10 three-hour sessions over the course of 5 weeks. And the training is offered 5 times a year. She stated that the classroom is quite large so they can accommodate distancing. Encouragement and support are a significant part of the training. **Josh Fisher (Veteran Leadership Program)** announced that they are giving away turkeys on Nov.  $22^{nd}$  at 1 pm. Dina forwarded the flyer with all of the details to the group on 11/19.

**Dina Ciabattoni (CoC Coordinator)** asked if anyone had a comprehensive list of Thanksgiving meals in the area. None were noted. **UPDATE**: Thank you to those who sent Dina Thanksgiving meal events to share with the group.

Nancy Grieco (American Red Cross) noted the Red Cross responded to 10 events since our last meeting – 8 fires and 2 tornados. These events resulted in 14 cases including 35 clients (6 of whom were under the age of 17 and 1 who was older than 65 yrs old). Dina noted this tends to be a time of year with more house fires and she asked Nancy for any tips. Nancy suggested plugging space heaters directly into outlets and if an extension cord is used ensure it is a heavy duty one.

### Lighthouse

### **Monique Anderson**

Monique from the Salvation Army presented on the Lighthouse transitional housing program. This program is for households with children who are continuing their work on their recovery from substance use disorder. In fact, eligible households will have 4 months of clean time and will be in treatment. Treatment can help to formally demonstrate this clean time. Households

must have CYS involvement and can only be referred to the program by CYS. The program does conduct random drug screenings. However, the program is not as restrictive as Harmony House is. And families whose children are not currently with them are expected to achieve reunification within 3 months. Case management and transportation are provided. ### Point in Time survey

### Dina Ciabattoni

Dina noted that the 2022 Point In Time survey will take place on January  $26^{th}$ . The first planning meeting will take place on 12/7/2021 on Zoom.

https://us02web.zoom.us/j/81461889590?pwd=YVBRZGd6dXo4WHFCZDZKMEw0eTV3Zz09 Dina explained that this is a 24 hour survey to give us a snap shot of homelessness in the County. She noted that there is a sheltered portion which is done by pulling HMIS data on the day of the survey. And also an unsheltered portion where we historically conduct extensive outreach to count all persons who are unsheltered during the 24 hour period. She recalled that our methodology was limited last year due to Covid and it is yet to be determined how the survey will be conducted this year so as to limit the risk of Covid transmission to the greatest extent possible. If you are interested in helping to plan and/or to volunteer let Dina know. She noted that there are a variety of ways that volunteers can assist (not just by doing outreach). The information gathered during the PIT survey will be used locally to gauge our progress and it will become part of a formal report to HUD.

### **Update on CoC Competition**

### Dina Ciabattoni

Dina shared that the CoC funding application was submitted on Nov. 13<sup>th</sup>. She reported that we applied for \$2 million dollars. \$1.8 million is for renewing existing projects and \$107,500 was for 2 new projects. The new projects are to expand the Salvation Army's Rapid Rehousing program by providing additional case management. And the other is to expand Coordinator Entry to hire an additional part time screener. See the attached chart for funding amounts of all the applying projects. Dina stated that it typically takes HUD 3-4 months to determine the funding allotments, so she is expecting their announcement in the spring. She will let this group know when the announcement is made.

Bed Availability Dina Ciabattoni

Dina shared the bed availability chart and noted that several programs have openings. Also the CE numbers did not shift significantly from last month although she notes the PSH list has gone down slightly over the last several months. No further questions were asked.

Dina also mentioned that we are in the process of trying to schedule another round of Covid-19 vaccine clinics both for initial shots and boosters. TCBC will be hosting one at their location (600  $6^{th}$  Street Beaver Falls, PA 15009) on 12/16 from 10am -12pm. They will also be distributing winter gear and supplies.

Dina also reminded the group that the next Coalition meeting will be on Dec.  $9^{th}$  – the second Thursday of the month. We historically hold the Coalition meetings on the second Thursday of every month but we adjusted this month to accommodate schedules around Veteran Days.
